Narrative:

We didn't plan this out much, just went out with the idea of seeing as many species as possible and hit some areas we hadn't birded much or had never been to. We ended up doing much better than anticipated! Bird of the day, initially, was a brief view of a Franklin's Gull flying up river near Bridgeport that we were not able to relocate. Then after a slower afternoon of driving around searching various small lakes and ponds for shorebirds without much luck, we stumbled upon a Hudsonian Godwit at Atkins Lake. A Peregrine Falcon flushed it up and it flew off shortly after we arrived, but all got great looks. We ended at Badger Mountain with an hour or so of light to spare. There was a lot more to find in that area, and this number could definitely be topped with a little more route planning and scouting.

Despite the challenge of the wind, we managed to do fairly well on most things, with only a handful of significant misses.
